भारत सरकार ने राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति, 2020 जारी की है जिसमें यह सिफारिश की गई है कि छात्रों को बोर्ड परीक्षाओं में अपना प्रदर्शन सुधारने का अवसर दिया जाएगा। माननीय शिक्षा मंत्री की अध्यक्षता में शिक्षा मंत्रालय में एक बैठक आयोजित की गई जिसमें निम्नलिखित पर विचार विमर्श सम्पन्न हुआ:

- 1) दसवीं कक्षा में 2025-2026 में दो बोर्ड परीक्षाएं आयोजित की जाएं।
- 2) इसके लिए एक मसौदा नीति विकसित की जाए।
- 3) इस मसौदा नीति को सभी हितधारकों स्कूल, शिक्षक, अभिभावक, छात्र और अन्य (सामान्य जनता आदि)से प्रतिक्रिया प्राप्त करने के लिए सीबीएसई वेबसाइट पर होस्ट किया जाए।

तदनुसार , व्यापक विचार-विमर्श के बाद मसौदा नीति विकसित की गई है जो सीबीएसई की वेबसाइट <https://www.cbse.gov.in> पर उपलब्ध है।

हितधारक 09.03.2025 तक ड्राफ्ट नीति पर प्रतिक्रिया दे सकते हैं। प्रतिक्रियाओं की जांच की जाएगी और नीति को अंतिम रूप दिया जाएगा।

- 2) A draft Policy for the same be developed.
- 3) This draft Policy be hosted on CBSE Website for getting responses from all stakeholders, i.e. schools, teachers, parents, students and others (General Public etc.).

Stakeholders may respond to the Draft Policy by 09.03.2025. The responses would be scrutinized and policy be finalized.

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**DRAFT SCHEME**  
**FOR TWO EXAMINATIONS,**  
**CLASS X FROM 2026**

The government of India has released the National Education Policy 2020. In this policy, the following are the recommendations for the examinations:-

**PARA 4.37 OF NEP-2020**

While the Board exams for Grades 10 and 12 will be continued, the existing system of Board and entrance examinations shall be reformed to eliminate the need for undertaking coaching classes. To reverse these harmful effects of the current assessment system, Board exams will be redesigned to encourage holistic development; students will be able to choose many of the subjects in which they take Board exams, depending on their individualized interests. Board exams will also be made 'easier', in the sense that they will test primarily core capacities/competencies rather than months of coaching and memorization; any student who has been going to and making a basic effort in a school class will be able to pass and do well in the corresponding subject Board Exam without much additional effort. **To further eliminate the 'high stakes' aspect of Board Exams, all students will be allowed to take Board Exams on up to two occasions during any given school year, one main examination and one for improvement, if desired.**

**PARA 4.38 OF NEP-2020**

In addition to introducing greater flexibility, student choice, and best-of-two attempts, assessments that primarily test core capacities must be the immediate key reforms to all Board exams. Boards may over time also develop further viable models of Board Exams that reduce pressure and the coaching culture. Some possibilities include: a system of annual/semester/modular Board Exams could be developed - that each test far less material, and are taken immediately after the corresponding course is taken in school - so that the pressure from exams is better distributed, less intense, and less high-stakes across the Secondary Stage; all

subjects and corresponding assessments, beginning with mathematics, could be offered at two levels, with students doing some of their subjects at the standard level and some at a higher level; and Board exams in certain subjects could be redesigned to have two parts – one part of an objective type with multiple-choice questions and the other of a descriptive type.

### **ACTION TAKEN BY THE CBSE ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF NEP-2020**

1. A draft scheme for the conduct of 2 Board examinations for Class X has been developed.
2. It is proposed that the scheme be implemented from the 2026 examinations of Class X.

### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PROPOSED SCHEME

1. Class X and Class XII examinations will begin on the first Tuesday after 15 February.
2. It is expected that in Class X, in 2026, about 26.60 Lakh students and in Class XII, about 20 Lakh students will appear in the examinations.
3. Both the examinations will be conducted on the full current syllabus and the text-books.
4. Except Science, Maths, Social Science, Hindi, English, rest of the subjects are grouped in the following manner:-
  - (i) A Regional and Foreign languages in one group
  - (ii) Rest of the subjects in one group
5. Examination of Science, Maths, Social Science, Hindi and English will be conducted on a fixed day as done currently.
6. Examination of Regional and Foreign Languages will be done in one go on a single day.
7. \*Examination of remaining subjects will be conducted 2 times to 3 times based on the choices of the students on 2 or 3 days. Meaning thereby, the Data Science examination will be conducted on two or three days. The students will be allotted the day of the examination based on the formula devised by the CBSE and the subject combination offered by the student. Students will not be given a choice to select the dates of examinations. The question papers of these subjects will be taken back from the students after examination is over.

10. The scheme of studies and scheme of examinations will remain will be reduced.
11. In this scheme, the facilities extended to CWSN candidates will be taken care as taken care of now.
12. For the Sport's students, they have to appear in any of the two Board Examinations of Class X and no separate examination will be conducted for them.
13. The examination centres will be fixed for the 1<sup>st</sup> examination, and for the 2<sup>nd</sup> examination too, the same centres shall be allotted.
14. LOC will be completed by September end of the previous year from the year of conduct of examination.
15. After submission of LOC, no change in the subjects offered will be allowed. This will be considered only in the second examination.
16. Filling of LOC for the first examination will be compulsory. Option for both examinations will be obtained in the LOC when filling for the first examination. No new name will be added to the LOC of the second examination.
17. For second examinations, LOC will be made live immediately after the result declaration only for **opting out of second examinations**.
18. All schedules will be fixed and there will not be any deviation in the schedule.
19. Examination fee will be enhanced and collected for both examinations at the time of filling of LOC for the first time which would be non-refundable if once paid.
20. First/ Second examinations will also act as Supplementary examinations.
21. No special examination will be conducted in any circumstances.
22. Facilities of verification, Photocopy and revaluation extended after the result declaration to the students will be reviewed and framed in accordance with the availability of time.

23. Schools will be assessed for becoming an examination centre and issued a letter/certificate in this regard to ensure the quality of examination centres.
24. No self-centre will be fixed. If there is no school near to a sponsoring school and as per policy if the examination centre is at a distance, needful arrangements will be made by the sponsoring school.
25. Only on National Gazetted Holidays, examinations will not be conducted. Restricted holidays and state holidays, the schedule of examinations will be fixed and accordingly examinations will be conducted.
26. Candidates as per defined eligibility will be allowed to appear in the 1<sup>st</sup> examinations.
27. No passing document will be issued after the result of 1<sup>st</sup> examinations.
28. Performance of 1<sup>st</sup> examination will be made available in DigiLocker. This could be used for admission to class XI if the student does not wish to appear in 2<sup>nd</sup> examination.
29. All the candidates will be issued passing documents after the second examination result.
30. Practical/ Internal assessment will be done only once.
31. Mark Sheet cum Passing Certificate will have marks secured in the first examination, the second examination, marks secured in Practical/Internal assessment and Grades. Also, better of the two marks will also be mention.
32. Students not qualified in the 1<sup>st</sup> examination could be allowed admission in Class XI and based on the result of the 2<sup>nd</sup> examination, their admission be finalised.
33. A merit certificate will be issued after 2<sup>nd</sup> examination.
34. Students qualifying all 5 subjects will be declared as pass.
35. Students who failed to pass from 1 to 5 subjects in 1<sup>st</sup> examination will be placed under the "Improvement Category" and will be allowed to appear in 2<sup>nd</sup> examination to be held in July 2026.
36. The syllabus for any examination will be the syllabus of the year of examination.

37. Additional Subjects will not be permitted. This means that after passing class X, students will not be allowed in stand-alone subjects.
38. If a student is declared pass by replacing the 6<sup>th</sup>/7<sup>th</sup> subject will be eligible for improvement in the failed subject only for the next two examinations from their 1<sup>st</sup> examinations.
39. After submission of LOC, no subject will be changed. If any student wishes to change the subject after submission of LOC, this will only be allowed in 2<sup>nd</sup> examination. Such students can opt not to appear in that subject during the 1<sup>st</sup> examination. If they appear in the 1<sup>st</sup> examination, they will not be permitted to change the subject in 2<sup>nd</sup> examination.
40. Students appeared only in the 2<sup>nd</sup> examination, no further examination will be conducted. Such students will be allowed to appear in the 1<sup>st</sup> examination of the subsequent year, but the syllabus shall be the syllabus applicable for the subsequent year.
41. After the feedback, the policy will be reviewed, revised and finalised.
42. Examination-Bye-Laws will be amended suitably.
